Branca men keep cutting through the decades

Raffaele "Ralph" Branca thought he'd seen everything while creating every imaginable men's hairstyle since his barbering days started in 1956. Ralph, 82, cut hair for a few hundred thousand customers, styled long hair, short hair, curly hair, wavy hair, crew cuts, and the once-popular, slicked-back DA in shops he owned in downtown Sharon and Hermitage.

Then his grandson, Chad Branca, 26, joined Ralph's Barber Shop five years ago.

"Everything changed when Chad joined me and started doing those 'design' cuts," Ralph chuckles. "I'd never seen anything like those. I was doing just the regular cuts."

"Chad is doing great. We enjoy working together. He has a lot of energy. Business is up as he's brought in a whole new group of young people."

Spend a little time at the shop and it's obvious that Ralph and Chad enjoy working together.

"It is awesome, not too many people can say they work with their grandfather," says Chad. "He is old school, I'm new school, but we work together very well, tease each other, and learn from each other."

One recent business day, Ralph arrived as usual at 7:30 a.m. for the 8 a.m. shop

opening. Chad entered at 8:03 a.m. Ralph reminded Chad many times throughout the day that he was "late."

Chad learned the 'design' art styles on the job from practice and customers bringing in photos of what they want. He works his art forms with usual barber trimmers and razors to produce image designs such as logos, names, letters, or numbers into clients' hair.

Ralph's business increase is consistent with the US barber industry being up almost 2 percent in the past five years. Chad estimates about 5 percent of his clients are young women requesting 'designs' on the back of their head to be visible when their hair is up.

Ralph apprenticed back in the 1950s under the late Leonard "Pecky" DeCapua at the Cozy Barber Shop in downtown Sharon. Chad apprenticed with Ralph after starting at Raphaels Barber Academy in Niles, OH.

Today, Chad is full time while Ralph works a few days a week. Ralph retains several clients he's cut for more than 50 years.

"I still enjoy cutting hair," Ralph says. "It gets me out of the house doing something I love."



Other barbers at Ralph's shop are his brother, Ernie Branca; Seth Wallace; and Tom Anderson.

Chad teams with Ralph's daughter, Tina, in coming up with a line of Branca Men hair styling products. Manufactured at Tina's California base, products include shampoo, conditioners, beeswax paste, pomade, hairspray and gels. They are available at the shop, 2011 E. 2019 Budgets Approved

On December 19, 2018 the Hermitage Board of Commissioners approved the City's 2019 budgets which total \$20.1M, including the General and Sewer Funds. There is no increase in taxes or fees and staffing levels will be maintained. It is anticipated that revenues in 2019 will remain stable, enabling the City to sustain existing services and capital programs. City officials place a high priority on maintaining a sound infrastructure system. Several projects will be undertaken in 2019 including:

- Phase I of Block 6 of the Neighborhood Investment Program. Carroll Ln. and part of Michael Ln. will have stormwater facilities improved and added, the old pavement milled off, roadway base repaired and new pavement installed. Two additional street lights have been added to the neighborhood and new street signs will be installed with the project.
Estimated cost - \$500,000.

- The Thornton Ave. Bike Lanes/Intersection

Improvement Project will involve reconstruction of the intersection with Forker Blvd. to eliminate the current "Y" intersection and replace it with the traditional "T" intersection. Also, the roadway from the Hermitage/Sharon line to Forker Blvd. will be repaved and widened to add bike lanes on both sides. A bike lane will also be constructed along Forker Blvd to the entrance with Buhl Park.

Estimated cost - \$590,000.

- The South Darby Rd. Stormwater & Roadway Improvement Project, between Virginia Rd. and Miller Rd. will make significant improvements to stormwater facilities and rebuild the roadway.
Estimated cost - \$430,000.
- A project to improve stormwater facilities near the intersection of S. Keel Ridge Rd. and Morefield Rd. will involve increasing capacity during heavy rainfall events.
Estimated cost - \$50,000.
- The traffic signals at Keel Ridge Rd. and E. State St. will be replaced, including poles,

mast arms, signal heads and controller.
Estimated cost - \$250,000.

- Work will be completed on the Hermitage Athletic Complex Phase III Project which involves the creation of additional open playfields and extending the existing trail system at the complex.

Estimated cost - \$245,000.

- Work will begin on the Hermitage Athletic Complex Maintenance & Storage Facility Project which involves the construction of a storage building to house City equipment and equipment used by sports organizations.


Estimated cost - \$240,000.

Other capital expenditures include new vehicles and lab equipment for the Police Department, facility improvements at Fire Station #1, a large salt truck and 1-ton dump truck for the Street Department, new commercial mowers for building and grounds maintenance and miscellaneous improvements at the Municipal Building.



First Use of Flashing Yellow Signals in Mercer County

Oil City, PA – The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) has activated a new type of left turn signal at two intersections along East State Street (Route 3008) in the City of Hermitage, Mercer County. Flashing Yellow Arrow signals, which have been proven to improve left turn safety, will be placed at the intersections of East State Street and Ellis Avenue, and East State Street and North Kerrwood Drive/ South Kerrwood Drive.

Sewer Bill Payments in 2019

Beginning March 1, 2019, the online bill payment for sewer bills will switch from Transaction Express to a Customer Self Service Portal.



Customers will be able to reach the portal through our website by pushing the "Pay Now" button on our home screen. With the portal, customers will no longer be required to enter their Account # to reach the payment page.

Instead, customers will have the option to look up their bill online and pay by credit card or e-check OR create a login within the portal. By creating a login, customers can pay current bills, view billing history and link several account numbers to one username.

The current bill pay webpage will be under maintenance the last week of February while the website is updated. Customers who plan to pay their February bill by credit card should submit payment online before the end of the month. Otherwise, customers will need to pay by check via the drop box at the City building or through the FNB lockbox.

Crime Prevention Tip:

Before your winter trip to Florida, a Caribbean resort or Arizona here is some

advice to help prevent home burglary. Don't advertise on social media you are going on vacation or will be away from home. Everybody is friends with someone on social media and your friend's friend may not be the kind of friend you want knowing you will not be home. With the internet it is fairly easy to search anyone's address online. You may also want to wait to post vacation pictures until you are home as posting a picture of you in real time on a Florida beach clearly says you are not home. "Checking in" at a popular restaurant in New York City also hints you are not home.

Have a trusted neighbor or family member keep an eye on your home and get your mail while you are gone. You know you have a good neighbor if they also shovel snow for you while you are gone to make your place look lived in. Though putting an interior light on a timer has been around forever it still helps deter some burglars. Dusk-to-dawn exterior lights work great too. Don't forget to lock those doors and windows and double check they are firmly secure before leaving.

The Hermitage Police Department still provides vacation house check services. Depending on how busy we are we will attempt to check the exterior of your home a couple of times a week. The forms are in the police department lobby.

Traffic Safety Tip:

Pennsylvania allows the use of ice grips or studded tires on vehicles for better traction in snow and ice. Studded tires bite into snow and ice for better traction but can slide a little when rapidly breaking or accelerating on clear or dry paved road surfaces. Pennsylvania only allows the use of ice grips or studded tires between November 1 and April 15. Studded tires are a bit noisy (clicking sound) on good roads and draw the attention of most police officers especially during the summer months.


A good set of winter-tread or all-season tires works decently when driving prudently

on winter roads too. Using summer-tread tires in the winter in Pennsylvania is not advisable. Remember, the PA minimum for tread depth for tires is 2/32 of an inch, but tires with more tread are recommended for winter travelling. Banana skin tires (bald tires) are unsafe and illegal.

Follow the tire manufactures recommendation on tire pressure. Tires have the maximum cold pressure in pounds per square inch (PSI) listed on the sidewalls. Under or over inflated tires (too little or too much air pressure) can negatively impact traction (cornering, braking and accelerating), tire wear and fuel mileage. If you are unsure about how much air to put in your tires, see a qualified mechanic.



Clean Up...It's the Law



City Ordinance, Chapter 2/Animals, Section 111/Nuisance, Subsection 3 states: Any dog or cat which scratches, digs or defecates upon any lawn, tree, shrub, plant, building or any other public or private property, other than the property of the owner or person in charge or control or such animal is hereby declared to be a nuisance.

Sub-section 6 states the following:

It shall be the responsibility of the person or persons aggrieved by such nuisances to file the complaint with the District Justice. [Ord. 11-98].

From the Fire Chief's Desk

Happy New Year to you and your family from the entire Hermitage Volunteer Fire Department. The fire department is excited for the

up and coming year with many changes and improvements. We are so very grateful for the continued support by our residents and community leaders. Truly, without everyone's support, we could not be what we are today. Our annual Truck Fund Drive materials have been mailed and you should have received it by now. As always, any little bit will go a long way. Thank you in advance for any donation you are able to give.

Winter is here, so I would like to take a moment and discuss safety concerns about carbon monoxide.

Carbon monoxide is often referred to as the silent killer. Carbon monoxide is an odorless, colorless gas created when fuels such as gasoline, wood, natural gas, propane and oil burn incompletely. In the home,

heating and cooking equipment that burn fuel can be sources of carbon monoxide. Like smoke detectors, we strongly suggest a carbon monoxide detector for every home.

Here are some things you need to know:

- CO detectors should be installed in a central location outside each sleeping area and on every level of your home. For the best protection, interconnect all CO alarms throughout the home, so when one sounds, they all sound.
- Test CO alarms at least once a month; replace them according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- If the audible trouble signal sounds, check for low batteries. If the battery is low, replace it. If it still sounds, call your gas company or the fire department.
- If the CO detector sounds, immediately move to a fresh air location outdoors



or by an open window or door. Make sure everyone inside the home is accounted for. Call for help from a fresh air location and stay there until emergency personnel arrive.

- Never warm-up a vehicle inside a garage, even if garage doors are open. After starting your vehicle remove it from the garage immediately. Do not run a vehicle or other fueled engines indoors. Make sure the exhaust pipes are exhausting to an outside uncovered location.
- During and after a snowstorm, make sure vents for your dryer, furnace, stove, wood burners and fireplace are clear of snow build-up.
- Generators should be used in a well ventilated location outdoors away from windows, doors and vent openings.
- Signs and systems of carbon monoxide poisoning are: headache, weakness, dizziness, nausea or vomiting, shortness of breath, confusion, blurred vision or loss of consciousness.

**Safety and preplanning can go a long ways, so remember:
"Keep safety in mind.
It will save your behind."**

With the start of the New Year, there are a few reminders I would like to share with you. Our tax bills are mailed twice a year. The County/City portion of your real estate bill goes out on March 1st of each year. There is no change for 2019 in your County/City bill. County remains at 23.65 mills and the City holds at 5 mills. The school bill along with the per capita bills are mailed on August 1st.

If you have not ever applied for the Homestead exemption, you should do so as soon as possible. You can download the form from the county website or pick one up in our

office at your convenience.

You only apply one time unless you change your deed or purchase a new house. Remember you may only collect the discount once. Your name must be on the deed and that parcel must be your residence. For example, if you have a home here and a vacation home or rental property, you cannot receive the exemption on anything except your main residence. So if this pertains to you, please contact our office.

Also, we are asking all rentals to register with our office even if a family member is

living in that house. This information is necessary to update our City census.
