

Yard waste collection will take place as part of your normal curbside collection on a weekly basis starting the week of April 12th and ending the 2nd week in December.

Green Lid = YARD WASTE



(Green-lid) yard waste carts or biodegradable bags may be placed at the curb on a weekly basis on your regular collection day, the week of April 12th through the 2nd week in December. There is no limit to the amount of biodegradable bags a household can place at the curb.

Acceptable yard waste includes:
Leaves, Grass clippings, Plants and flowers, Roots, Sawdust, Shrubbery and pruning, Branches, tree limbs under 3" in diameter, Brush up to 3' in length.

LindenPointe DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION



The eAcademy@LindenPointe looked a little different this year offering hybrid learning through a generous grant from First Energy Foundation Gifts of the Season. Thirty senior high school students from area school districts were accepted into the seventh year of the dual enrollment program. The collaborative program teaches business, entrepreneurial, and leadership skills while exposing students to real-world business operations. The LindenPointe Development Corporation operates the program and also oversees the eCenter@LindenPointe, a business incubator.

During the academic year startup teams progressed through three main curriculum

resources:

1. MITs 23 Steps to a Successful Startup by Bill Aulet from Massachusetts Institute of Technology
2. Entrepreneurship: The Practice and Mindset by Heidi Neck from Babson College
3. Corporate teambuilding and training workshops designed to increase workforce development and soft skills

The three main resources supported the students through the processes of ideation, customer development, product design, and group dynamics. Eight startup teams produced investment pitches, lean business plans, and prototypes for their ideas. One of the

teams, Full Access, placed first at a local idea competition and was approached by a leading economic development agency to further their startup.

Tours of regional businesses, and guest speakers throughout the year added tangible value to the program. This year some of the guest speakers included: Cyber Security expert Jonathan Steenland, Penn Northwest Executive Director Rod Wilt, Leadership Shenango Cohort, and Cloud Wars Top 10 Founder Bob Evans.

Student tours of area businesses started with Buhl Farm Park and boating on Lake Julia, the Food Waste to Energy Facility, and then small businesses in downtown Sharon. Students also toured the Grove City Airport, speaking with the Skydive Pennsylvania Team, visited the Shenango River Lake and Dam with the US Army Corps of Engineers, and toured the BRITE Energy Innovators Labs in Warren Ohio. The year ended with an outdoor teambuilding activity at Go Ape Ropes Course in Pittsburgh.

All in all this was a difficult and challenging year as everyone lived through a pandemic and students adjusted to hybrid learning, despite that eAcademy still demonstrated the grit and determination of startup businesses and what can be accomplished even in times of adversity.

From the Chief of Police

Eric Jewell, City of Hermitage Chief of Police



Community Engagement:

Part of improving community relations and building greater trust is getting to know the officers of the Hermitage Police

Department (HPD) and learning what they do and why. HPD is hosting its first ever Citizens Police Academy to introduce residents to various aspects of law enforcement and the criminal justice system as a whole. Attendees will learn interesting facts, see demonstrations and equipment, tour HPD, and meet a variety of HPD officers and members of the local criminal justice system. If you want to gain a better understanding of practical applications of the law, police procedural dynamics or are interested in police work or criminal justice in general or as a career, please apply. The Academy is scheduled to begin on Wednesday, September 1, 2021; from 5:30 pm to 8pm; and continue every Wednesday through November 3, 2021. There is a simple application/selection process and class size will be limited to approximately 20 attendees. Join us for an interesting, informative and enjoyable time. Traffic Safety:

The Hermitage round-about intersection is a huge traffic safety improvement success according to Hermitage Police Department crash data to date. Since the round-about's opening last year, there have been only three reported minor crashes (accidents) as follows:

1. One crash involved an intoxicated driver who failed to maintain control around the rotary. The drunken driving issue is a no brainer so we won't further discuss the obvious fact the vehicle operator was incapable of safe driving in the first place.
2. One crash involved a vehicle striking the

rear of another motorist who was waiting to enter the circle. Every driver has a duty to bring his/her vehicle to a stop within the assured clear distance ahead to avoid rear-ending a slowing or stopped vehicle. Always watch your twelve o'clock (front) approaching a round-about.

3. One crash involved a motorist who failed to yield right of way to traffic already in the round-about. Yielding to priority traffic already in the circle is a must. Remember, you do not need to stop at the yield sign if the immediate round-about section is free of approaching traffic. Always watch your nine o'clock (left) when entering the round-about and yield if necessary.

In closing, there are three normal yield responsibilities for every driver with respect to safely negotiating a round-about intersection. These responsibilities are yielding to pedestrians in crosswalks, yielding to slowing or stopped traffic in front of your vehicle and yielding to traffic already in the circle. That said, slow down upon approach, figure your timing to safely merge, enter without stopping if clear or yield (slow down or stop) if traffic is present, and do not stop while in the round-about.

Crime Prevention:

As the warm weather finally reaches us the yard work and outdoor recreational activities begin. At the end of the play or work day remember to put away expensive tools (chain saws, weed trimmers, ladders, lawn mowers, toolboxes, etc.) and toys (ATVs, bicycles, sports equipment, etc.) in locked sheds and garages. Keep a description (make, model, serial number, etc.) of high value tools and toys to give to police should they be stolen. Locked doors and windows, security lights and cameras, alarm systems and trusted neighbors looking out for one another all help reduce theft. Should you become the victim of theft or observe a suspicious person, vehicle or activity call Hermitage police immediately at 911 for an in-progress crime or emergency and 724-662-6110 for after the fact crime reporting or non-emergency.

Know the Law:

Many residents have asked if owning, possessing or using a stun gun or taser is

lawful in Pennsylvania. Use or Possession of Electric or Electronic Incapacitation Device, Pennsylvania Crimes Code Section 908.1; says, in part, "A person commits an offense if the person does any of the following: (1) Uses an electric or electronic incapacitation device on another person for an unlawful purpose" and (2) possesses, with intent to violate paragraph (1), an electric or electronic incapacitation device." However, Section 908.1 lists self defense as an exception to the law by saying, in part, "A person may possess and use an electric or electronic incapacitation device in the exercise of reasonable force in the defense of the person or the person's property..." Any person who is prohibited by law from possessing a firearm may not possess or use an an electric or electronic incapacitation device. Read Section 908.1 in its entirety for additional important information.

From the Fire Chief's Desk

As spring is approaching, the Hermitage Fire Department has seen an up tic in grass fires and brush fires. This is mainly due to people burning during high wind conditions. As

a reminder, during windy days, you are not allowed to burn. If a hot ember blows into the dry grass, the fire could spread very rapidly which might cause damage to your property or your neighbor's property. If you cause damage to your neighbor's property, you are financially responsible for the damage. Please check the weather conditions prior to burning.

There's nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook food. But, a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. Here are some simple tips for safe grilling.

SAFETY TIPS:

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.

- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill. Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

CHARCOAL GRILLS:

- There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.

GAS GRILLS:

Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department. If you smell gas while cooking, immediately shut the grill off and get away from the grill. If the leaking gas catches fire, call the fire department. Do not move the grill while the grill is lit. If the flame goes out while cooking, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least 5 minutes before re-lighting it.

Remember, whether you own a home or rent an apartment, you are required to register all members of your household who are over the age of 18 for Per Capita billing. The amount of the head tax this year is \$30.00 per person.

We always have Homestead forms in our office. If you have never applied or have had a deed change, give us a call and we will explain the process to you.

We also have Tax rebate forms available.

We are asking all rentals to register with our office even if a family member is living in that house. This information is necessary to update our City census.
