Wood fired ovens with smoked meats and pizzas thrive at Smoky Martins BBQ

Home style, homemade recipes are standard fare at Smoky Martins BBQ, 3601 E. State St., near the Shenango Valley Mall in the former Murcko's Restaurant building. Martins brought wood fired ovens and smoked meats to the Shenango Valley in early 2020.

"I am proud to make most of our dishes on-site, using fresh ingredients, including our potato salads, cheese sauces for mac and cheese, and the red sauce for our pizzas using real plum tomatoes," says owner Ron Martin. "We don't cut corners on preparation, and it shows in the quality of our food."

Smoked brisket, smoked ribs, and wood-fired pizzas are among the most popular selections. Texas Twinkies, which are cream cheese and brisket stuffed jalapenos wrapped in bacon and wood fired, and potato pancakes served with sour cream or apple sauce, are also big sellers. Brisket chili is a recent award winner.

From the feature menu, the smoked flank steak French dip sandwich is popular.

Smoky Martins top-line, artisan Mugnaini wood-fired oven reaches 700-800 degrees to bake pizzas in three-four minutes. Thursday evening is an all-you-can-eat pizza buffet.

The restaurant smokers burn through about a cord of wood, or a dump truck-size load, every three weeks.

A love of cooking led to Ron Martin opening the original Smoky Martins BBQ seven years ago in Meadville. Ron was always the designated and popular chef at friend's hunting camps.

Smoky Martins caters weddings and parks with its fully equipped food truck at numerous special events in the region.

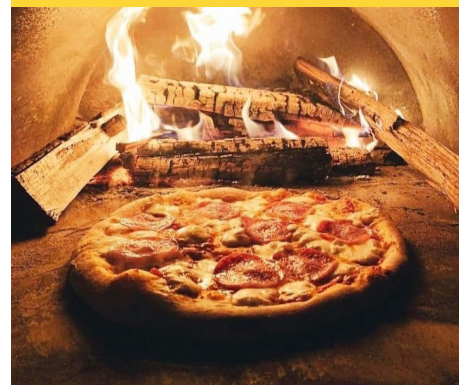

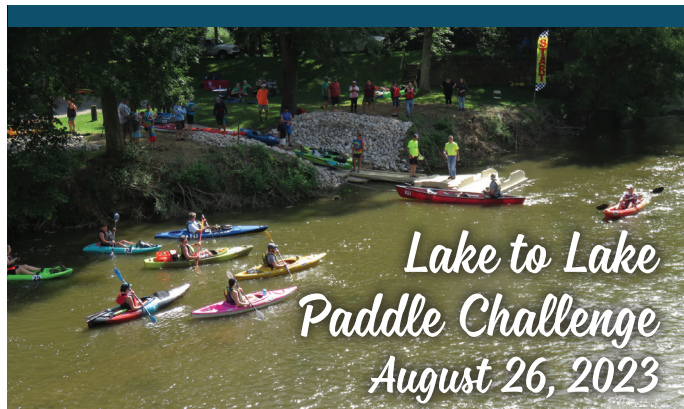

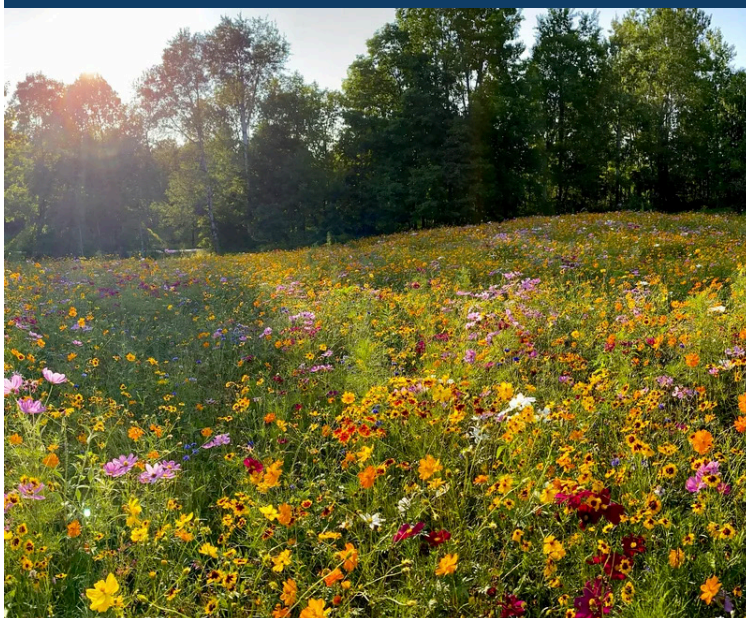

From the Fire Chief

When it comes time to think quickly, you need to have a go-to plan and then a back-up plan. Humans are creatures of habit. We do things the same way over and over, it becomes second nature. We don't even think about doing it. The problem comes when something throws us off that routine. Why do I bring this up? I bring this up because you must have an exit plan during an emergency. How will you get out if the way you came in, is blocked? If you haven't planned for

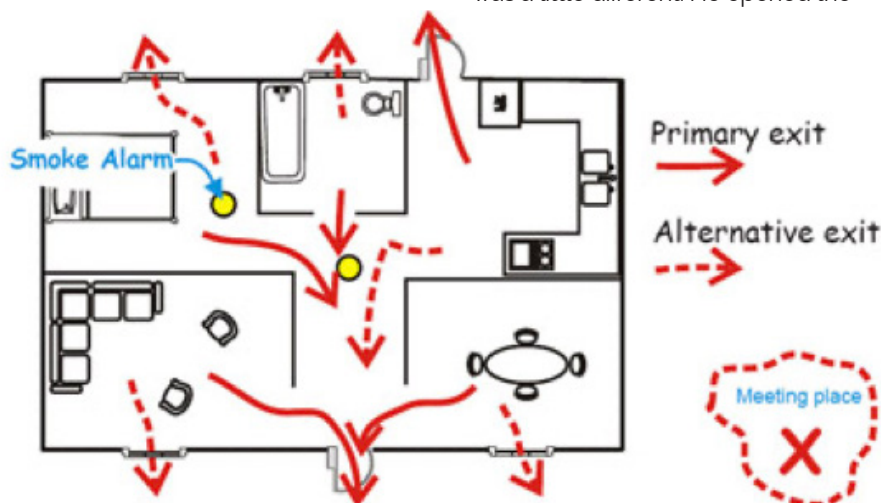
a contingency, panic will set in and who knows what you will do.

Recently we had a structure fire. The fire happened early in the morning while the family was sleeping. Their normal path of egress was blocked by fire. The teenager opens her door to investigate, realizing her normal path of egress was blocked. She quickly shut the bedroom door, smashed out the window and jumped out to safety. Her father's story was a little different. He opened the



bedroom door and was met with high heat and dense smoke from the ceiling to the floor. His normal exit to his vehicle, which he used every morning and night, was blocked by the fire. He told me he panicked and froze. At that moment he thought he was going to die. He didn't know what to do. His wife, with her plan B, yelled to him to break out the windows and jump to safety. As they did that, they received multiple cuts, but the alternative was to stay with plan A and most likely become a fire statistic. He told me if it wasn't for her having a back-up escape plan, they might not have made it out. He said, "she is a true hero".

Whether you are at home or out on the town, always have another exit plan. Be aware of your surroundings. We watch on



the news major incidents where people get crushed or trampled trying to exit out of a facility when there are other exits that no one is using. When I go into a restaurant and they seat me at a table, I always look for an alternate exit. I will most likely not use the same door I came in from if there is an emergency. Why? I know everyone else will be rushing for that door.

If it is a fire, active shooter, earthquake, or even a medical emergency, know where your closest exit is located and have a backup plan in case that exit is



blocked. If you have ever flown before, the flight attendant always points out the exits to you prior to leaving. Make sure

you take a moment and look around. Get to know your surroundings. The closest exit might be right next to you. The International Fire Code provides requirements for businesses on how many exits are required for the occupancy load and type of occupancy. These codes are there for our safety and have been put in place because of lessons learned from previous incidents.

Please remember to look around and have a plan B.

From the Desk of the Treasurer

Hello Summer! County/City tax bills saw no change in amount and were mailed on March 1, 2023.

As a reminder, you may have noticed on your bills, that it reads separate checks for all bills. To further explain, you may still combine "like" bills to one check,

For example, if paying more than one County/City bill, they may be combined to one check. The same holds true for multiple Per Capita bills as well as multiple School bills. You can no longer combine any of the three to one check. They all have separate accounts and need to be paid with separate checks. The note on the bills seemed a bit confusing at first, but we want to thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Per Capita bills will be mailed on August 1st and are due at the discount amount from August 1st through September 30th. October 1st through November 30th is the face period and December 1st through December 31st, they are due at penalty. As of January 2nd, 2024, all unpaid Per Capita bills will be turned over to Sharp Collections.

Anyone moving to or from Hermitage

is encouraged to notify our office to either add you to our Per Capita and census or to remove you as needed. All residents over the age of 18 are required to pay Per Capita. The face amount this year is \$30.00.

There is a partial exoneration from Per Capita if your annual income is less than \$12,000.00 from all sources, but you must come into the office with proof of income each year. This level has been raised from the previous amount of \$10,000.00. For a total exoneration, you must show proof of income under \$5000.00 annually.

School Real Estate taxes, which also are mailed August 1st, remain the same for the 2023 billing, but will reflect an increase in the assessed value of our Homestead Exemption to 2046.00, making this year's discount amount \$136.48. If you have purchased a new home or made any change to your deed, you may need to re-apply. We will be glad to help you through that, so just call our office. The school board has again approved a resolution for 2023 School taxes ONLY, decreasing the penalty to 0% on all School taxes paid through December 31st, 2023.



The discount period remains the same -August 1st through September 30th. This will also apply to the payment plan for your School Taxes, but keep in mind that you must make the first payment by August 31st to be eligible for this plan. Please bring in both sections of your bills if needing a receipt. If you mail your bill, kindly include both parts along with your self-addressed stamped envelope, and we will gladly return your stamped receipt.

Always notify us if you have not received your bills.

Landlords, please remember to update your rental properties with our office.

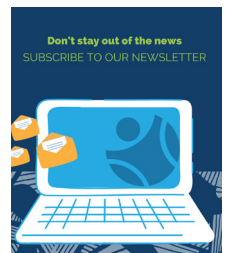
