## Scotto's Pizza dishes up authentic Italian cuisine

True Italian fare from a menu rivaling a thick New York City telephone book blends with a jovial atmosphere at Scotto's Pizza, 2090 E. State Street between Rent-A-Center and Monro Auto Service.

The Ferraiolo brothers, owners Carlo and Rosario, put decades of Italian restaurant experience to use in offering pizzas in numerous styles and toppings, stromboli, wings, pepperoni rolls, calamari, appetizers and antipasto, sandwiches and wraps, Romaine salads, and about a dozen pasta dinners with a grand finale of a New York City favorite, Junior's Most Fabulous Cheesecakes.

"We love doing this," says Carlo. "We enjoy our customers in this small-town atmosphere and getting to know many of them. This is a nice community that appreciates quality Italian food. Many of our current customers followed us from the (Shenango Valley) mall."

The brothers were born in Naples, Italy and came to the U.S. about 35 years ago. First up was owning and operating a Scotto's Pizza franchise in the Eastwood Mall, Niles, Ohio, then a Scotto's in the Shenango Valley Mall.

The current State Street location is the brother's restaurant since 2012. New York style thin crust pizza is Scotto's most popular item.

Topping choices are roasted red peppers, fresh basil, ground beef, anchovies, sausage both hot or sweet, ham, spinach, shrimp, bacon, broccoli, meatballs, and many more.

Gluten-free and low-carb cauliflower crust pizzas are quite popular, Carlo says, since their menu introduction about five years ago. Patrons say these alternatives are very tasty, unlike many gluten-free options, he adds.

Diners come for the traditional Italian treats and get a side order of goodwill at no extra charge.

# THE YEAR IN REVIEW AND A LOOK AHEAD

The City of Hermitage experienced a year of growth in 2023 and is poised for further expansion in 2024, with several community and economic development projects pending. In 2023, nearly 150 building permits were issued with total construction costs of over \$66 million, highlighted by a new 250,000 square foot, \$34 million FedEx distribution center adding hundreds of new jobs to the local economy. Other notable projects include a new 10,000 square foot, \$3.5 million headquarters for Mercer County Community Federal Credit Union, to be completed in March; a new DQ Grill and Chill on E. State Street; a 2,500 square foot expansion of the Buhl Park Golf Center, to include golf simulators; and building renovations for a new MP Coney Island, which will include a restaurant and Chili Sauce canning facility. Retrofits include the first Pennsylvania location of One Hot Cookie, in the Hermitage Square Plaza, and Jersey Mikes, coming to the Hermitage Towne Plaza.

The slate for 2024 includes a 212,000 square foot addition to the Joy Cone Cookie Plant, a \$40 million project. Joy, the world's largest ice cream cone manufacturer, has diversified into cookie and wafer production, and expects to reach 1,000 workers over the next few years. Construction will also start for a new Starbucks, a \$2.3 million project, and for McAlister's Deli and Valvoline Instant Oil Change located on adjacent parcels, each representing \$1.4 million projects.

The redevelopment of the 54-acre Shenango Valley Mall property into a mixed-use Town Center is expected to start in 2024, with litigation finally resolved. Butterfl Holdings

acquired the property and affiliated developer, Flicore, will raze the mall and redevelop the property to include retail, restaurant and entertainment establishments. The City will deploy \$5.5 million in grant funds to buildout the Town Center, to include pedestrian connectivity, outdoor gathering space, and recreational amenities, and envisions residential development onsite. The location is the busiest intersection between suburban Erie and suburban Pittsburgh and is primed for development.

An emphasis on quality-of-life investments also marked 2023 and will carry over into 2024. A record \$2 million was invested in neighborhood paving and stormwater projects with additional projects identified for 2024. Over \$1.4 million in grants will bring sewer extensions to another 92 residents and afford residential growth along the S. Neshannock Road corridor. New Master Site Plans were adopted for the 42-acre Stull Nature Reserve, a passive park/environmental learning space, and for the Hermitage Athletic Complex (HAC), envisioning additional ballfields and flat fields, and new pickleball courts, a bicycle pump track, and youth climbing area. At the close of 2023, a new Dek Hockey Facility was constructed at the HAC, supported by a \$231,000 state grant; and a state award of \$350,000 will help construct trails into the complex.

Overall, the city continues to grow and officials are excited to welcome new businesses, residents, and visitors as we enter 2024.

## Winter Road Maintenance Services

The winter maintenance services provided by the City of Hermitage Street Department covers an extensive network of over 98 miles of city streets, including coverage of over 5 miles in the Wheatland neighborhood. Additionally, the city extends its winter maintenance services to specific state roads through an annual payment arrangement.

1. North & South Neshannock Road (city line at Clark to city line at Shenango Twp.)
2. North & South Keel Ridge Road (Valley View Road to city line at Shenango Twp.)
3. Dutch Lane (entire length)
4. Lamor Road (city line at Sharpsville to city line at Jefferson Twp.)
5. Ohio Street (Church Street to South Stateline Road)
6. Highland Road (North Hermitage Road to city line at Sharon)
7. Maple Drive (East State Street to Freeway)
8. Mercer Avenue (Freeway to city line at Farrell)
9. Mercer Avenue (Farrell city line to Broadway Avenue)
10. Council Avenue (Mercer Avenue to Broadway Avenue)
11. Church Street (entire length)
12. Thornton Avenue (city line at Sharon to Forker Avenue)

In a change from past practice and effective with this winter season, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PENNDOT) will now handle winter maintenance services for the entire length of East State Street (PA 0062) within the City of Hermitage. This marks a departure from the previous agreement where the city maintained a section of East State Street under an

arrangement with PENNDOT.

The Street Department is also involved in winter maintenance activities on Buhl Park roadways while the Building & Grounds staff contributes to the upkeep of driveways and parking lots at city parks and at all city buildings. City streets and state roads are divided into winter maintenance routes with the department utilizing 11 large trucks and 3 small trucks, all equipped with salt spreaders and plows, operated by city employees. On average, approximately 5,000 tons of road salt are used each winter.



A reminder is issued to property owners and residents to refrain from parking vehicles along streets during winter weather events. This is emphasized due to the adverse impact on the effectiveness and efficiency of winter maintenance efforts, as parked vehicles can impede snow removal and result in them being "plowed in."

# 2024 CITY BUDGET APPROVED

The approved 2024 budget maintains the same real estate and earned income tax rates for the 33rd consecutive year. The General Fund budget totals \$16,242,406 of which \$2,016,036 will be transferred to add funding to capital budgets for infrastructure maintenance and major equipment purchases. Capital project expenditures planned for 2024 include \$2M in street paving and stormwater system improvements, \$800,000 in public safety equipment, \$250,000 for public works equipment and for improvements to parks and recreation facilities, and continued investment in technology upgrades and building maintenance. The 2024 budget includes allocating \$450,000 for capital improvements to infrastructure in the Wheatland neighborhood funded by former Borough of Wheatland reserve funds coming to the City of Hermitage because of the merger. The city intends to make some improvements to Esther Viglio Hall at the former Wheatland Borough building and continue community rental opportunities there.

The 2024 Sewer Fund budget totals \$7,828,467, including additional revenue from the Wheatland neighborhood area of the city. The Food Waste to Energy Program, which accepts food waste from various parts of the food industry and converts it to electricity, will be expanding after two years of reduced capacity due to required repairs to equipment. During 2024 the Hermitage Municipal Authority will be expanding the municipal sanitary sewer system with a project along South Neshannock Road and parts of Virginia Road and Miller Road, adding customers and making vacant land available for development.

Planning is underway to implement scheduling at the newly constructed DEK hockey facility at the Hermitage Athletic

Complex to allow for maximum use by the community, as well as to expand access to other facilities at the Complex and add more trails there. Existing community events – Night Markets, Earth Day, Arts Festival, Winter Solstice, Holiday Light Parade, the Summer Recreation Program and Summer Youth Camp will all return with plans to expand and improve. The city will continue to publish the quarterly newsletter with information from the city, Hermitage School District, and various regional non-profit organizations along with the monthly e-newsletter and maintain our robust social media initiatives, all to better inform the Hermitage community. Programs such as free library cards to the Community Library of the Shenango Valley and outdoor pool passes at Buhl Park at 50% discount will remain available to residents.

An initiative to work with our small business owners in support of their efforts to create an organization to promote small, locally owned businesses will move forward during the upcoming year, along with continued work with the new owners toward the redevelopment of the former Shenango Valley Mall property. New, or expanded, businesses in the city projected for 2024 include the Mercer County Community Federal Credit Union, Starbucks, Valvoline, McAlister's Deli, MP Coney Island, Jersey Mike's, and Joy Cone's new cookie plant.

The budget provides a high level of municipal services as well as investment in infrastructure and equipment. It also supports a high quality of life for the community – strong, effective public safety forces, the promotion of economic development, and varied and numerous opportunities for arts and recreation – to keep the community vibrant and property values strong.

## Entreprenuer of the Year Award

Hermitage resident, Kara Wasser was awarded the 2023 Entrepreneur of the Year by the Haller Enterprise Institute, during a ceremony at Thiel College on November 14th. Wasser is Founder and CEO of OhanaLink Technologies, which is based at the eCenter@LindenPointe in Hermitage. She previously founded Dub Diversified, LLC where she created the concept for Ohana ink Baby, a smartphone app that bridges communication



app that bridges communication gaps between patients (expectant mothers) and their families and friends. Specifically, it provides a virtual waiting room where information may be shared securely.

and marketed cutting-edge mobile device applications. Its product, OhanaLink Purple, has transformed the way agencies and advocates deliver services to victims of domestic abuse and their families. It also represents a partnership between domestic violence agencies across Western Pennsylvania.

At the ceremony, Wasser related the ups and downs of her personal journey in the entrepreneurship space. She emphasized her perseverance and determination to successfully take her product to market and she encouraged budding entrepreneurs to take advantage of local and state resources in building out their concept.

## Young Economic Development Professional to Watch Award



Jake Rickert, Director of Workforce Development for Penn Northwest Development Corporation, was presented the Young Economic Development Professional to Watch Award at the Pennsylvania Economic Development Association Fall Conference in Reading, PA. Jake spearheads the Homegrown Initiative, which aims to grow our local population by matching young adults to rewarding jobs in Mercer County.

Penn Northwest Development Corporation is Mercer County's lead economic development agency and is headquartered in Hermitage at the eCenter@LindenPointe. The City of Hermitage is a member and long-standing supporter of Penn Northwest and has partnered with the agency to deliver several economic development projects in the city.

We congratulate Jake on this significant recognition and appreciate all his work in growing the workforce in Mercer County and helping our next generation to prosper here.

## WHEATLAND MERGER COMPLETE

On January 1st, the Borough of Wheatland merged into the City of Hermitage and the area will now be referred to as the Wheatland neighborhood of the City of Hermitage. While there will be several changes, a few things will remain the same. Mail service will not change as it is handled by the U.S. Postal Service, which is not affected by the merger. The Wheatland Post Office will continue as will the Wheatland mailing address and zip code. School attendance boundaries are also not affected by the merger, so children residing in the Wheatland neighborhood will continue to be part of the Farrell Area School District.

Sewer billing for the Wheatland neighborhood will now be handled by the City of Hermitage. A letter was sent to all Wheatland residents and businesses detailing this change. In a nutshell, in early January a final bill will be sent to residents and businesses served by the Farrell Water Pollution Control Plant, by the City of Farrell. In February, these residents and businesses will receive their first sewer bill from the City of Hermitage. The residential charge is a flat monthly fee of \$47.50 regardless of water consumption. Businesses will be billed a fee based upon their consumption.

The City of Hermitage also assesses an annual Business License fee of \$200 with certain exemptions available for businesses with \$50,000 or less in annual gross sales, and exemptions under state law for non-profits, manufacturers, banks, and insurance companies. A form must be completed and filed with the office of Hermitage Treasurer, Bernie Harry. Exemptions must be claimed using the form. The completed form and fee are due by April 15th of each year.

Property owners in the Wheatland neighborhood of the City of Hermitage will experience an 80% reduction in their municipal property taxes as the city has a much lower property tax millage than Wheatland had. City/County property tax bills are mailed in March and property owners will notice the reduced millage on the

city portion of this property tax bill.

School property tax bills are mailed in August and property owners in the Wheatland neighborhood of the City of Hermitage will continue to be assessed school property taxes based upon the Farrell Area School District rate. This is because these properties will continue to be within the attendance boundaries of the Farrell Area School District. In August, Per Capita taxes are also mailed. This is a flat tax on each adult resident with \$20 assessed by the city and \$10 assessed by the Farrell Area School District, for a total of \$30. A low-income exemption is available but must be applied for annually, with proof of income supplied. Individuals with an annual income of \$5,000 or less may be exonerated from the entire \$30 while those with incomes between \$5,000 and \$12,000 may be exonerated from the city portion only, which is \$20.

Since residents of the Wheatland neighborhood now live in the City of Hermitage, those who are employed will be subject to the Hermitage rate for the Earned Income Tax (EIT), which is 1.75% plus the Farrell Area School District rate of .5%, for an overall rate of 2.25%. This is higher than the former Wheatland/Farrell Area School District combined rate of 1.5%. Employers were notified by Berkheimer Tax Collection to apply the higher rate beginning in 2024, but employees should double check with their employer to avoid a tax bill at tax filing time.

Of course, Wheatland neighborhood residents and businesses will enjoy all the municipal services and benefits provided by the City of Hermitage. These include free library cards through the Community Library of the Shenango Valley, a 50% discount on swimming passes at the Buhl Park swimming pool, and access to Hermitage youth recreation and summer camp programs. Additionally, the former Wheatland Borough Building will continue to have office hours on Mondays, Tuesdays and Fridays from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. and the Esther H. Viglio Social Hall will continue to be available for rental.

## UPMC Horizon and the City of Hermitage Partner to Launch Minutes Matter

In an emergency, minutes matter. A crisis can happen anytime, anywhere, and even the most basic education can turn a bystander into a life-saving neighbor, friend, or family member. Minutes Matter, a new partnership launched this week between UPMC Horizon and the City of Hermitage, provides community members access to fundamental emergency information and education about life-saving interventions.

"We're proud to partner with the city on this important initiative because you don't have to be a trained medical professional to make a difference in someone's life," said Zachary Lenhart, vice-president, operations, UPMC Horizon. "Learning simple, easy-to-understand emergency skills empowers bystanders to provide critical help during these life-threatening and highly stressful situations."

UPMC's Minutes Matter teaches community members how to respond to common, life-threatening emergencies related to opioid overdose, mental health crisis, uncontrolled bleeding, and cardiac arrest through training in the use of an automated external defibrillator (AED), Narcan usage and a tourniquet, as well as how to administer effective CPR.

"This training impacts everyone; the parent of a child whose heart suddenly stops, or someone who comes home to find their partner overdosed, or the person whose friend was just shot in front of them," said Gary Gulla, assistant city manager. "This is not the time to bury our heads and pretend like this stuff doesn't happen. Thanks to this training, you can be the one to save their life. This does not have to be their time to go."

From calling 911, to clearing a path for emergency responders and securing pets, even the most basic education can save lives and improve outcomes. With training, bystanders will recognize a problem more quickly and know what to do until first responders arrive.

"How those first few minutes are handled during a medical or overdose emergency greatly impacts a person's survival rate of that event," said Michele Albaugh, nurse coordinator, UPMC Horizon. "One in ten will survive a cardiac arrest if the only intervention provided is dialing 911. Five in ten will survive a cardiac arrest if chest compressions are provided and an AED is used."





Through the PCC, students have the opportunity to obtain 2 industry-recognized certifications, CompTIA Network+ and CompTIA Security+. As of recently, the PCC was 1 of 19 PA-based projects chosen to receive funding from the Appalachian Regional Commission's POWER grant and was awarded \$1.15M to expand their efforts. This funding will be the launchpad for future program growth as the PCC will use this for the expansion of its job training and placement program into seven new counties. The PCC is making a local impact as the program was also able to host the Cyber Patriot competition this year. This national youth cyber education program helps direct students toward careers in cybersecurity or other STEM fields and is taught at Hickory High School by computer science teachers Megan Geisel and Joe Kulbacki. ## Hickory High School Unified Bocce team thrives in its eighth season

The Special Olympics Unified Bocce program began at Hickory High School in the fall of 2015. This program was initiated in schools to promote social inclusion through shared sports training and competition experiences for people with and without intellectual disabilities. According to the Special Olympics Unified Bocce handbook, this means that, "every player is given an opportunity to contribute to the success of his or her team through their unique skills and qualities." At the time of its inception, Hickory High School, the Special Olympics Association, and Slippery Rock University collaborated to institute a pilot program. Veteran special education teacher, Mrs. Kim Smith, took on the role as the head of the new program. Mrs. Smith worked with Special Olympics and Slippery Rock University students to build a team and a program that, to this day, engages all team members in "meaningful involvement". Through the collaboration between Mrs. Smith, SRU student-coaches, and students from the Life skills and general education classrooms, the program continued to grow; and, in the fall of 2019, the bocce team doubled from one team to two. Currently, the team is coached by Mrs. Laura Mount, Mrs. Cheri Manners, and Mrs. Kerri McCowien. Mount and Manners have been with the teams since 2019; while McCowien joined in 2022, upon Mrs. Smith's retirement. There are 18 student athletes on the 2023-24 team.

A unique additional component to all Unified Sports programs is that each team is required to develop and implement a fundraising event. The results of the team's efforts have increased just as the participants have. In fact, Hickory High School, through its "April Showers" fundraising campaign, has been a

top fundraising school for all of Western Pennsylvania for several years.

The Bocce program now includes a Bocce Club as one of the building's organized clubs. It supports the team and its fundraising efforts. HHS Bocce also enjoys a growing student fan base in the school; and, more importantly, has opened the doors of inclusion. Our HHS Bocce team is breaking down stereotypes and demonstrating that all students have the value and the skills to make a lasting impact on the school community. We are extremely proud of what the program has brought to our school!




## Hickory High School hosts its 13th-annual Business Week

## Cyber Security class competes in CyberPatriot competition


Mrs. Megan Geisel's Cyber Security class at Hickory High School is at the forefront of preparing students for the challenges of the digital age by competing in the CyberPatriot Competition. Mrs. Geisel partnered with Penn State University faculty member, Mr. Matthew DeMaria, to support the students during the competition. Mr. DeMaria has been a welcome resource in helping the students with some of the more technical aspects of the competition, such as the Cisco Packet Tracer activity.

CyberPatriot is the National Youth Cyber Education Program created by the Air & Space Forces Association to inspire K-12 students toward careers in cybersecurity or other science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) disciplines critical to our nation's future.

CyberPatriot is a national competition that is open to all schools and approved youth organizations throughout the

United States. The competition, which is for 9-12 graders, is broken into rounds where it challenges students to secure virtual operating systems and networks. In each round, students get a number of virtual machines that are loaded with computer viruses, malware, unidentified users, users with incorrect permission, or any number of other issues that could compromise an organization's network. The virtual machines could be Debian, Ubuntu, Windows 11, Windows Server 22 and more. The students are given three to four hours to find the compromising issues in each of the virtual machines for points. Each security issue they find and eradicate gives them points towards their team total. At the end of each round, the points are totaled and the teams are ranked. In this year's competition, two of our HHS teams advanced to the semi-finals, which took place Friday, January 19th. We are excited for the opportunities the Cyber Security class has to offer our students. In addition to the competition, students can enroll in a cyber security certification program through Linden Pointe or Penn State University, as well as earn PSU college credits.

# From the Fire Chief

The members of the fire department are hoping you had a safe and happy holiday season. You have probably received our annual truck fund support packet. This packet was mailed to all the businesses and residents of Hermitage. We encourage everyone to help support the fire department and our mission. This is the only packet we send out to our residents during the year. If you receive something in the mail other than our packet, or get a phone call requesting a donation from us, it is not us.

We are excited to announce our new program, Community Connect. This program is a great tool for our responding firefighters. This program is free to Hermitage residents and can make a big difference if you need our services. When you set up your account, which is a very secure account, you will be asked several questions about your home, hazards, special needs, and contact information. It is best to complete the entire questionnaire. If you have an emergency and need the fire department, we will be able to access this information while we are enroute to your location. When time is of the utmost importance, the information you have provided will make us more prepared when we arrive on scene.

So far, we have had a couple hundred people sign up for this program. One resident put in their description that their bedrooms are on the second floor. The master bedroom is at the front of the


house and the two children's bedrooms are at the back of the house. In the event of a fire at night, we will know immediately where to look for any of their missing family members. The program also can tell us if there is someone living in the home that needs extra help getting out, or is bed ridden. You can tell us about your pet's, friendly or aggressive, and even upload a picture so we can identify them quickly.

Our firefighters' safety is also very important. With this program you will be able to tell us about different hazards within your home. For example, we know there are a lot of homes within Hermitage that have oxygen bottles inside their homes due to health issues. During a fire, this can be very dangerous to our firefighters and has the potential of injuring one of them during a fire attack. With the Community Connect program, you can identify this type of hazard and the storage location of these oxygen bottles. This information will help us make safer decisions and, in the end, will help us keep our firefighters safe.

I have created an account for my home, and I have shared information about my family members and our pets, three bulldogs. It

is easy to set up an account, and filling out the information only took a few minutes. Here is the website to create your account for your home and family: <https://www.communityconnect.io/info/pa-hermitage>

# From the Desk of the Treasurer

**Bernie Harry, City Treasurer**

Welcome 2024 and welcome to all new Hermitage residents! Our office is open to the public from 8:00a.m. to 4:00p.m., Monday through Friday except legal holidays, and you can reach us by phone or e-mail with any concerns you may have.

For your convenience, we carry forms for Rent and Tax rebates as well as Homestead applications in our office.

Just a reminder that tax bills are mailed twice a year. The County/City portion of your real estate bill goes out on March 1st of each year. The school bill along with the per capita bills are mailed on August 1st. If you do not receive your bills around the mailing dates, please notify us and keep in mind that it is the home-owners responsibility to know the due dates of taxes. It is important to keep your original bill for payment.

I'd like to explain the note on your bills stating that we need separate checks for each bill. Your County/City bill is one combined bill requiring only one check for the total amount due. Should you own more than one parcel, all County/City bills

may be made payable with one check if you so choose. School bills require a separate check as do your County/City, and Per Capita bills. Again, like bills may be combined but different bills cannot!

School bills and December courtesy notices both explain that we cannot accept personal checks for any payment after December 15th of the current year. After that date, you may still pay until December 31st by bank check, cash or money order. Personal checks received after Dec. 15th will be returned to the owner.

Whether you rent or own your home, you must register with the city for per capita tax billing. Per Capita tax is a head tax levied on anyone over the age of 18, living in the City of Hermitage. It remains at \$30.00 per person. When making payments, it is not necessary to come in, you can mail your payment or leave it in the secure drop box on the north side driveway. If you need a receipt, please include your entire bill along with a self-addressed stamped envelope, and we will return the stamped receipt to you.



Remember to register all rental properties with our office even if a family member is living there. This information is necessary to update our City census.
