Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) Federal Co-Chair visits LindenPointe Innovative Business Campus

Earl Gohl discusses business plan strategies with the Entrepreneurship Academy students

On Tuesday, April 28, 2015, the ARC Federal Co-Chair spent the afternoon visiting with the Entrepreneurship Academy & the eCenter@LindenPointe. Mr. Gohl addressed the Entrepreneurship Academy students giving them an understanding of both the history and the mission of ARC. The students, all seniors, from seven (7) different Mercer County high schools participate in a one of kind entrepreneurial based educational opportunity.

The students capitalized on the opportunity to converse with a U.S. Senior Official and explained their six (6) individual business plans to Mr. Gohl. Local educational leaders including Lisa Evans, Academy Instructor, Dr. Cathleen Cubelic, Midwestern Intermediate IV and Kim Zippie, Superintendent, Commodore Perry School District discussed the program benefits including regional excursions to various manufacturing, educational and entrepreneurial sites, the full year entrepreneurship curriculum and college credits earned through Butler County Community College.

Mr. Gohl commented "When we see projects like the Entrepreneurship Academy you have to be impressed by the energy that the leadership has brought to this project and the energy in that room. The concept is really to develop and to nurture the next generation of entrepreneurs and in that room, you clearly have a whole slew of next generation entrepreneurs". He added "It is a great idea and a great investment to take public dollars, whether they be local or federal, to do projects like this that changes the trajectory of kids."

The ARC provided \$200,000 towards the construction of the Training & Workforce Development Center. The City of Hermitage partnered with the ARC and the US Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration (EDA) providing an additional \$600,000 towards the facility which is used for workforce training in the Oh-Penn Interstate Region.

Mr. Gohl, accompanied by Guy Land Chief of Staff, visited with Yvonne English, Executive Director, eCenter and several incubator tenant companies including:

Several community and economic development partners hosted the visit including Gary Hinkson, City Manager, Gary Gulla, Assistant City Manager, Jill Foys, Northwest Commission and Randy Seitz, Penn Northwest Development Corporation. Gary Gulla praised the support provided by ARC and stated that "Our local efforts to transform economic development, to create an entrepreneurial ecosystem and to implement the innovative LindenPointe initiatives are only possible due to the engagement of many partners. The ARC's strategic investments in the Training & Workforce Development Center and the eLab equipment in the eCenter have been invaluable and ARC has played a significant role in our successes."

The ARC is a regional economic development agency that represents a partnership of federal, state, and local government. Established by an act of Congress in 1965, ARC is composed of the governors of the 13 Appalachian states and a federal co-chair, who is appointed by the president. Local participation is provided through multi-county local development districts.

ARC funds projects that increase job opportunities and per capita income, strengthens the capacity of the people to compete in the global economy, and develops and improves infrastructure to make the Appalachian Region economically competitive. ARC's mission is to be a strategic partner and advocate for sustainable community and economic development in Appalachia.

The completion of the 2014-2015 scholastic year also marked the end of the first year of student participation in the Entrepreneurship Academy @Linden Pointe. Through this program, twenty students from seven surrounding schools, including six from Hickory High School, learned how to create a small business along with the development of the entrepreneurial mindset involving communication, innovation, and professional skills

The Final Competition between the six businesses was held on May 12th, 2015 in the J. Pew Fine Arts Center on the campus of Grove City College. Each team of students approached the stage to pitch their businesses to an audience of fellow classmates, friends, family, their high school administration and a panel of six judges. Prior to the day of the competition, each team submitted a business plan covering their company operations, necessities for a successful startup, advertising plans, and financial projections and individual contributions to the team.

Business Teams were comprised of multiple members from differing school districts that evolved their own unique business ideas over the course of the year.

- **BlankCanvis** is a social network for artists to sell and buy products, post their portfolio for others to see, and for anyone to search locally to find collaborators on an artistic project.
- **Honey Badger Inc.** is devoted to offer the most innovative product line in America while striving to make their name known to the world.
- **Footmark Tracking** is a company that provides the best technology in the archery market through a sound trackable arrow.
- **Rhodora Technology** provides the gift of business simplicity through technology applications and advancements to small business in the Mercer County Area.
- The purpose of **Silver Platter** is to create easy to use apps that revolutionize the way the world dines.

- **The Next Step** developed a website directed towards high school students that will ease the stress and struggle that goes along with finding the Next Step in life.

Rhodora Technology, represented by Brianna Dzuricko, won the final competition. Second place was awarded to Footmark Tracking, represented by Kyle Boyd. The winning Rhodora Technology four person team split \$2500.00 in prize money and Footmark Tracking's three person team split \$1250.00. A panel of judges comprised of Penn State Shenango faculty and eCenter @LindenPointe staff determined the winners based on the presentation given that day, and by a pre-submitted formal business plan.

The skills learned and connections made during this past year of class influenced the students to take many different paths after high school graduation. Out of the twenty students, one will be serving in the Military, and eighteen are attending a college, university or trade school where their business skills and college credit for this program and extra classes through Butler County Community College will be utilized. A majority of the class will remain in Western Pennsylvania either attending college or working on their own personal business ideas, some of which are linked with the eCenter @LindenPointe.

Regardless of the career choice or plans after high school graduation, this opportunity to work in a real-world business atmosphere has given students the skill set needed to succeed in a professional environment. After the completion of year one, the Entrepreneurship Academy has now created a connection between local school districts and its' program encourages creativity and innovation in the development of business. The Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development approved the funding and implementation of the "Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics (STEAM) Project" at LindenPointe. We are looking forward to its future and would like to thank Midwestern Intermediate Unit(IV) who partnered with the Franklin Center of Beaver County, participating school districts, EKME, Gilbert's Risk Solutions, First National Bank, Winner International and anyone else who helped make this opportunity possible.

Largest Horizontal Vacuum Furnace Coming to Solar Atmospheres of Western Pennsylvania



Solar Atmospheres of Western Pennsylvania announces that it will be installing the largest horizontal high vacuum furnace ever constructed at their Hermitage facility. The furnace will be engineered and manufactured by their sister company, Solar Manufacturing, Inc.

The entire investment for Solar Atmospheres will be in the order of \$8,000,000 including the cost of this large furnace, a new 20,000 square foot building addition, and utilities to operate this large system.

Robert Hill, President of Solar Atmospheres Western Pennsylvania, states "We will all be very busy over the next year, not only preparing a site to expand our current facility by another 20,000 square feet to house this newest piece of equipment, but also assembling and building the new equipment on-site. All of our employees are eagerly anticipating the day that we commission one of the most unique vacuum furnaces in the world."

This car-bottom type furnace Model HCB-84576-2EQ will have a work-zone that measures seven feet in diameter x forty-eight feet long and will be capable of handling loads up to 150,000 pounds at 2400°F. Dual US patented loading cars are provided for loading/unloading from both ends of this furnace with its 48 foot long hot zone.

The vacuum chamber is being manufactured by Youngberg Industries, Inc. of Rockford, IL and will incorporate three 48" diameter vacuum ports as well as six 24"

diameter ports for gas cooling inlet and outlet. Autoclave type locking doors are included at both ends of the furnace. Tom Larson, CEO of Youngberg Industries indicates "this is the largest horizontal high vacuum chamber they have ever manufactured."

The programs for the engineering and construction phases have been initiated with key orders placed for major system components. The ultimate goal is to have installation and testing completed by the first quarter of 2016.

Solar Atmospheres and Solar Manufacturing are part of the Solar Group of companies. Solar Atmospheres provides commercial heat treating and brazing services to a wide array of industries with four facilities located in Eastern and Western Pennsylvania, South Carolina, and California. Solar Manufacturing specializes in the manufacture of new vacuum furnaces as well as providing hot zone replacements and aftermarket spare parts and service.

From the Desk of the Treasurer



August 1st is the mail date for both your School Real Estate and Per Capita bills. It is your responsibility to notify the City in the event you do not receive them.

Per Capita is a head tax waged on every resident over the age of 18 and this year remains at \$35.00. There are exemptions,

(based on income from all sources) available to those who qualify. Upon receipt of your Per Capita bill, all proof of income must be brought into our office and a form filled out and signed by the person to be exempt. This process must be followed each year.

Real Estate taxes remain at 60.239 mills. Also, the Homestead/Farmstead approved amount for this year is 99.09 per parcel. This amount will show up as a credit on your School tax bill. The Homestead/Farmstead Act also enables taxpayers to satisfy their school taxes in payments.

This year the payment plan will be offered once again to all property owners in Hermitage. It is payable in 3 installments set by the School district.

The schedule is as follows. Bills mailed August 1

1st installment – on or before August 31st

2nd installment – on or before November 2nd

3rd installment – on or before December 15th

If these dates fall on a weekend or legal holiday, the due date will be the next business day.

Certain rules apply to these payments and they are explained on the tax bill. Please remember that all homestead approved properties must be owner-occupied. This means that the name on the deed must match the name of the person or persons who live in that house. Anyone who receives the homestead credit and does not meet the requirements is required to notify their tax collector of the necessary correction.

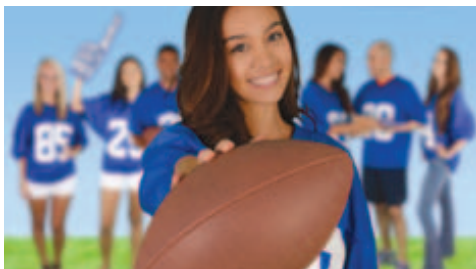
