La Isla offers Mexican specialties on East State Street

La Isla Mexican Restaurant was opened at 1800 E. State St., Hermitage, almost 18 years ago by brothers Lazaro Hernandez and Jesus Hernandez. Together, the brothers discovered the building then decided to fix it up and make it a Mexican restaurant. The name La Isla comes from the Mexico town in which they grew up. In December 2014, Jesus passed away and Lazaro took over the responsibilities.

Items on the La Isla menu are homemade daily and include fajitas, tacos, burritos, enchiladas, chimichangas, and tamales. Fajitas are popular with a favorite being the Jesus Special, which is chicken or steak atop rice and covered with cheese sauce. Margaritas are very popular, frozen or on the rocks, and come in several flavors.

"We are currently doing takeout orders and have been doing well, but not like normal business times," says Lazaro. "Not having our bar side open and not being able to serve alcoholic drinks has definitely caused a decrease in sales."

"During this time we are only able to use a couple waiters and cooks. They each work every other day rotating shifts. It breaks our hearts not being able to use our bartenders or hostesses right now. We can't wait to have them back to work. We cut our hours short for the time being to 11-8, but once everything is normal we can hopefully resume our normal business hours."

A major disappointment was not being able to have its annual Cinco de Mayo fiesta in the beginning of May. Lazaro said that the community looks forward to it every year and hopefully La Isla will be able to have its big party at a later date this summer.

While the Kelecseny family is busy with takeout and delivery orders, all look forward to customers and friends being able to return and eat inside.

CORONAVIRUS

COVID-19 Impacts City Operations

The COVID-19 pandemic has forced some adjustments to City operations as we work to continue to serve the community while following guidelines and mandates from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to protect our employees and stop the spread of the Coronavirus.

On March 20, a Declaration of Disaster Emergency was declared by the City followed by the closing of all City buildings, playgrounds and park restrooms to the public and the cancelling of all events scheduled at those buildings. Recycling programs at the City Garage, the issuance of Transient Business Licenses and inspections of occupied residential rental properties were suspended until further notice. Adjustments were made in employee work schedules and workplace locations to minimize contact between employees and emphasize social distancing. Additional cleaning/disinfecting programs were implemented in all departments, supplies and equipment were provided to departments and social distancing and personal hygiene

recommendations were emphasized to employees. In anticipation of budget impacts from the unemployment generated by the closing of businesses, a hiring freeze was put in place and spending has been restricted to those expenditures necessary to maintain basic operations. Capital projects funded through the 2020 budget have been temporarily placed on hold.

To assist those Hermitage businesses involved in the City's Revolving Loan Fund Program, the Commissioners have delayed the April, May and June payments without penalty. Also, the City is receiving approximately \$193,000 in federal Community Development Block Grant funding to deal with the impact of COVID-19. The City has been working with the PA Department of Community and Economic Development to develop a grant program for eligible small businesses in the City that have been negatively impacted by COVID-19.

Also, the annual Hermitage Arts Festival and the 2020 Hermitage Summer Parks and Rec programs have been cancelled.

As of May 18, all City buildings remain

closed to the public. However, the City continues to conduct business and all City departments are operating, with a few adjustments. The public can contact departments and employees via telephone and email. The most current adjustments to City operations, programs, events and activities can be found on the City website at www.hermitage.net.

Until further notice, all Hermitage Board of Commissioners meetings, as well as meetings of various City authorities, boards and commissions will be held remotely. Instructions on how the public can access to the meetings will be made available on the City website.

The City thanks all of its employees, in particular our first responders, for their work during these unprecedented times and the entire community for their efforts to minimize the spread of the Coronavirus. The City encourages everyone to support our local businesses as they work to recover from the significant financial losses they have incurred and continue to incur.

Hermitage Board of Commissioners Take Action to Suspend Revolving Loan Fund Repayments

The City operates a community and economic development loan fund to provide funding assistance to stimulate the expansion of business and industry for the purpose of creating jobs in the form of low interest financing for eligible economic development projects. Currently 6 businesses have outstanding loans through the program.

At the March 25th Board of Commissioners meeting, in an effort to assist local businesses, the Board suspended revolving loan fund payments of principal and interest for a 90-day period. With the COVID-19 pandemic and the resulting mitigation orders causing economic harm to the businesses the Board, with support from the Hermitage Community and Economic

Development Commission, temporarily suspended the monthly repayments for 3 months. The city felt that this action would aid the businesses cash flow while they were either forced to close under the Governor's Disaster Order and/or suffered irreparable harm due to the pandemic.

Hermitage Parks & Recreation

A Message from Our Facilities Coordinator

The City is committed to encouraging all residents to stay safe and healthy during the Covid-19 pandemic and as restrictions and guidelines change often we want to make sure all residents and visitors to our parks remain safe. Currently all parks remain open. However, all restroom facilities, playground facilities and drinking fountains located within the

parks will remain closed and turned off until further notice. We have kept our athletic fields open for use, but required social distancing guidelines remain in place. At any time a parent or legal guardian may use the athletic fields with their child on a first come first serve basis. No organized activities are permitted. The trail systems at our parks remain open

and we encourage our residents to use them. City staff remain committed to maintaining and cleaning parks weekly. We ask that all visitors use the trash receptacles and pet waste stations as needed and report any safety issues they see might be out of the ordinary.

Thank you citizens and business owners for your ongoing efforts in following Governor Wolf's COVID-19

mitigation order and other state and federal pandemic guidance. Despite the ongoing health crisis, the Hermitage Police Department has been and will continue to serve and protect its citizens, businesses and visitors 24-hours a day. Rest assured we are still arresting DUIs, shoplifters, domestic violence perpetrators, and other criminals; checking out suspicious persons and vehicles; slowing down speeders; and on routine patrol day and night. If you need police on a minor matter and the incident can be handled by phone, please tell the Mercer County 911 Dispatch an officer can call you. In most circumstances an officer will respond to your location if you request, but handling a minor call via phone during the pandemic is preferred given the social distancing recommendations for all. Additionally, an officer responding to your home may desire to talk outside or through a glass door to further practice good social distancing.

A special thanks is in order for local restaurants, businesses and individuals who dropped off food at the police department or who supplied homemade face coverings for officers. Your generosity to and thoughtfulness of our police first responders is very much appreciated.

Crime Prevention

Criminals never let a disaster or pandemic like COVID-19 go to waste. These opportunistic crooks are out there looking to prey on good people in a very vulnerable time. Watch out for thieves using high pressure or scare tactics and false information or bogus products trying to take your money. These fraudsters

will impersonate government employees online, through the mail, via email, over the phone or in person to defraud you by selling fake test kits, false cures, substandard medical equipment, incredible financial relief, and false investment opportunities (get-rich-quick schemes). Remember, the government doesn't contact you and ask for your personal information in order to get a financial benefit. If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is. Contact Hermitage police for a second opinion if you believe someone is or is possibly trying to defraud you.

Did You Know

Hermitage police officers on patrol have noticed and/or are stopping a large number of Pennsylvania vehicles whose vehicle license plate is fading, peeling or otherwise visibly defective through weathering or wearing. If your registration looks solid silver or your embossed alphanumeric characters are no longer dark, it needs replaced. The PA Vehicle Code, Section 1332(b-3), says "It is unlawful to display on any vehicle a registration plate which is otherwise illegible at a reasonable distance or is obscured in any manner." Generally, a reasonable distance to read a license plate is about 50 feet (around two car lengths) but weather, road and traffic conditions may expand or contract distance. Painting or using a Sharpie marker to spruce up the letters or numbers is discouraged as the now altered plate could inhibit automated enforcement systems (electronic plate readers), which is illegal. Applications for Replacement of Registration Plate (PA DOT Form MV-44) are located at PA DOT offices or www.dmv.pa.gov or in the HPD lobby for your convenience. To get your free, non-personalized, replacement registration plate, a police officer will have to verify the plate condition (on the affected vehicle) and sign the form. Per PA DOT, the form does not need to be notarized for this specific re-issue. You then mail the application to PA DOT and wait for your replacement.

Pedestrian Safety

Due to the expanse of the City of Hermitage most of us drive to the grocery store, to

visit a friend, to see a doctor, to dine at a restaurant, etc., but at some time during the day we become a pedestrian. Whether crossing the street to the mailbox, walking to or from the bus stop, traversing a parking lot, getting a run in or walking a dog, we are walking in close proximity to moving vehicles. Per the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), there was a 3% increase in pedestrians killed in traffic crashes in 2018, totaling 6,283 deaths. This figure was the most since 1990 and 2019 figures are projected to be even higher. Most pedestrian deaths occur at nighttime and many deaths happen in urban settings, open road conditions and intersections.

Adhere to the following NHTSA pedestrian and driving safety tips:

Walking Safety Tips

1. Be predictable. Follow the rules of the road and obey signs and signals.
2. Walk on sidewalks whenever they are available.
3. If there is no sidewalk, walk facing traffic and as far from traffic as possible.
4. Keep alert at all times; don't be distracted by electronic devices that take your eyes (and ears) off the road.
5. Whenever possible, cross streets at crosswalks or intersections, where drivers expect pedestrians. Look for cars in all directions, including those turning left or right.
6. If a crosswalk or intersection is not available, locate a well-lit area where you have the best view of traffic. Wait for a gap in traffic that allows enough time to cross safely; continue watching for traffic as you cross.
7. Never assume a driver sees you. Make eye contact with drivers as they approach to make sure you are seen.
8. Be visible at all times. Wear bright clothing during the day, and wear reflective materials or use a flashlight at night.
9. Watch for cars entering or exiting driveways, or backing up in parking lots.
10. Avoid alcohol and drugs when walking; they impair your abilities and your judgment.

From the Fire Chief's Desk

As we all work through the new normal related to COVID-19, I wanted to provide the citizens of Hermitage with an update on the fire

department's response to COVID-19 as it relates to emergency responses. Rest assured, if you need the fire department, we will be there in full force and do whatever it takes to protect life and property.

We are doing everything possible to maintain the health and safety of our firefighters. We are still responding to all the same emergency calls as before but with a few changes that we have incorporated as part of our own version of social distancing.

At this current time, we are not allowing visitors into any of our fire stations. Our administrative office is still open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday-Friday for any questions or concerns. If you need to contact our office, please do so by calling 724-342-0669. Anyone needing emergency assistance should dial 911 for immediate help.

The fire department does not respond

on medical calls unless the ambulance crews request our assistance. With any emergency we respond to, we will treat everyone as a potential COVID-19 patient. We will make direct patient contact with the smallest number of firefighters that is appropriate for the situation. Firefighters will only approach if needed and will have a mask, gloves, and gowns if needed. These measures are not only for our safety, but for the safety of the public we serve.

Despite some reports of personal protective equipment shortages, we are doing well so far. Several local businesses along with the city's logistics officer have been providing the necessary safety and sanitation supplies needed to protect our first responders and office staff. We also have a direct link to the Mercer County Emergency Management office for emergency supplies if needed.

At the onset of COVID-19 we initiated conversations with multiple businesses, facilities and mutual aid fire departments to develop plans to limit the exposure to the smallest number of firefighters as is appropriate. So far, it is working well, and we



continue to update our plan as needed. With everything we do, we see our residents and businesses not just as customers we serve, but as partners in keeping our community safe and healthy.

Thank you to everyone for the support you have shown to not only the fire department, but to your community and neighbors as well. By following the measures that have been put into place, we will get through this pandemic. Take this time of heightened awareness to also focus on personal safety and preparedness for all different types of hazards to protect your family and property.

This period in our lives will pass and when it does, let us be a stronger and more resilient community for the future.

Driving Safety Tips

1. Look out for pedestrians everywhere, at all times. Safety is a shared responsibility.
2. Use extra caution when driving in hard to-see conditions, such as nighttime or bad weather.
3. Slow down and be prepared to stop when turning or otherwise entering a crosswalk.
4. Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks and stop well back from the cross-walk to give other vehicles an opportunity to see the crossing pedestrians so they can stop too.
5. Never pass vehicles stopped at a crosswalk. There may be people

6. crossing that you can't see.
7. Never drive under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs.
8. Follow the speed limit, especially around people on the street.
9. Follow slower speed limits in school zones and in neighborhoods where children are present.
10. Be extra cautious when backing up pedestrians can move into your path.

Check out www.nhtsa.gov for more information.

The Pennsylvania Vehicle Code, in part, says "The driver of a vehicle must yield to a pedestrian crossing the roadway within any marked crosswalk or within any unmarked crosswalk at an intersection." However, "no

pedestrian shall suddenly leave a curb or other place of safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle which is so close as to constitute a hazard." The Vehicle Code also says "Every pedestrian crossing a roadway at any point other than within a crosswalk at an intersection or any marked crosswalk shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles upon the roadway." Pedestrians are to use available sidewalks and if no sidewalks, use the shoulder. If no shoulder, use the far edge of the roadway. Lastly, pedestrians must walk on the left side on two-way roads and obey pedestrian-control signals at intersections. Remember, both pedestrians and drivers have responsibilities to make our streets and roadways safer.

A Note from the Treasurer,

It looks like Spring has sprung with all the beautiful flowers in bloom! Welcome to all the new residents of Hermitage. Just a reminder that tax bills are mailed twice a year. The County/City portion of your real estate bill goes out on March 1st of each year. There is no change for 2020 in your County/City bill. County remains at 23.65 mills and the City holds at 5 mills. The school bill along with the per capita bills are mailed on August 1st. **I'd like to explain the note on your bills stating that we need separate checks for each bill. Your County/City bill is one combined bill requiring only one check for the entire total amount due. Should you own more than one parcel, all of those County/City bills may be made payable with one check if you so choose. School bills require a separate check as do your County/City, and Per Capita bills. Again, like bills may be combined but different bills cannot!**

If you have not ever applied for the Homestead exemption, you should do so as

soon as possible. You can download the form from the county website or call the office for one to be mailed to you. You only apply one time unless you change your deed or purchase a new house. Remember you may only collect the discount on 1 parcel. **Your name must be on the deed and that parcel must be your residence.** For example if you have a home here and a vacation home or rental property, you cannot receive the exemption on anything except your main residence. So if this pertains to you, please contact our office.

If you are new to the area, whether you rent or own your home, you must register with the City for per capita tax billing. Per Capita tax is a \$35.00 head tax levied on anyone over the age of 18, living in the City of Hermitage.

Our building has been closed to the public temporarily, but when making payments, remember it is not necessary to come in, you can mail your payment or leave it in the secure drop box on the north side driveway. Keep in mind that if you need a receipt, please include your entire bill along with a self-addressed

stamped envelope, and we will return the stamped receipt to you.

Due to the pandemic, the business License Tax deadline has been extended along with your Federal taxes to July 15th. After that date a late fee will apply.

Also, we are asking all rentals to register with our office even if a family member is living in that house. This information is necessary to update our City census.

Water Quality Corner

How to help stream pollution:

- Reduce the size of your lawn by adding landscaped beds with native trees, shrubs and perennials.
- Reduce watering. Lawns need to rest after the spring growth spurt.
- Use a mulching mower or dispose of clippings properly, either by composting or in your yard waste container.
- Do not dump clippings into streams, swales or stormwater facilities.
- Minimize fertilizers. Less fertilizer means less excess entering streams and lakes.
- Aerate your lawn to allow oxygen and water to become more available to root systems, reducing runoff.
- Set your mower at 3" to allow grass to out-compete weeds.
- Sharpen mower blades at least once a year.

Hermitage Kindergarten Registration 2020/2021

Kindergarten Registration was held at the Artman Elementary School on February 19, and February 20, 2020; our Make-Up Kindergarten Registration was scheduled for March 24, 2020, but had to be cancelled due to the state-mandated school closure. While we hope to hold a summer Kindergarten Registration event once we are permitted to re-open school; student registration can be completed online even during this time of mandated school closure.

ONLINE REGISTRATION PROCESS:

The Hermitage School District has an online registration process for all incoming students. Please go to our Website @ www.hermitage.k12.pa.us to access the online forms, fill in the required information and upload the necessary documents to complete your child's registration. We are requesting that you complete the online registration process for incoming Kindergarten

students soon so we are able to plan appropriately for the upcoming school year.

NOTE: If you do not have access to a computer, Chromebooks will be available at our Central Administration Office (411 N. Hermitage Rd.) for your use once we are permitted to re-open. We will post the re-open date in the Sharon Herald and on the Hermitage School District website once it has been confirmed.


